27th Asia-Pacific Roundtable 3–5 June 2013, Hilton Kuala Lumpur

The 27th Asia-Pacific Roundtable (APR) was organized by ISIS Malaysia, on behalf of the ASEAN Institutes of Strategic and International Studies (ASEAN-ISIS). The event brought together 395 security experts, policymakers, journalists and business leaders from 28 countries of the Asia Pacific, Europe and the Middle East. Themed 'Strategising Change in Asia', the Roundtable comprised ten plenary sessions, two distinguished luncheon addresses, a dinner talk and a tête-à-tête session. Discussions covered a wide gamut of issues, ranging from ways to build strategic trust in Asia, the South China Sea dispute, to the Mindanao peace process.

The Hon Prime Minister of Malaysia, Dato' Sri Mohd Najib Tun Abdul Razak, delivered the Keynote Address during the Welcoming Dinner on 3 June 2013. High level role players in attendance included the Hon Dr RM Marty M Natalegawa, the Indonesian Minister of Foreign Affairs, Pehin Dato Lim Jock Seng, Second Minister of Foreign Affairs and Trade of Brunei Darussalam, the Hon Mdm Fu Ying, Chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee at The National People's Congress (NPC) in China, the Hon Mr Igor V Morgulov, Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs of The Russian Federation, Amb Christopher R Hill, Dean of the Josef Korbel School of International Studies at the University of Denver as well as former Assistant Secretary of State for East Asian and Pacific Affairs, and Dr Akihiko Tanaka, President of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).



The Roundtable, co-organized by The International Council for Science Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific (ICSU-ROAP) and ISIS Malaysia, sought to learn about the emerging international research programme on global sustainability called 'Future Earth' and identify potential gaps in current research on global environmental change as well as opportunities to address within the 'Future Earth' framework. ASEAN Newsletter

This newsletter for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (now known as the Ministry of Foreign Affairs), Republic of Korea, was first published in 2011 as the *ASEAN Monthly Commentary*. In 2012, it assumed its current title of *ASEAN Newsletter*. The monthly newsletter consists of a compilation of articles on current economic, political and security affairs within the context of ASEAN and the Southeast Asian region. It also contains news updates.

Developing Constructs for Unity Index in Schools

ISIS was invited by the Ministry of Education as a consultant panelist on Developing Constructs for Unity Index in Schools from September 2013 till completion.

Enhancing and Deepening Malaysia's Political and Strategic Relations with China

This project hoped to contribute towards Malaysia's strategic thinking and approach towards China. The research was concerned with enhancing and consolidating Malaysia's political and strategic relations with China and aimed to provide policy-relevant recommendations towards this end. The report will be completed in early 2014.

The Green Technology Roadmap Review is a threemonth project commissioned by the Malaysian Green Technology Corporation. This study will feed into the preparation of Malaysia's Green Technology Masterplan.

Housing the Nation: Policies, Issues and Prospects

ISIS was commissioned to coordinate the production and publication of Cagamas Berhad's 25th anniversary publication entitled '*Housing the Nation: Policies, Issues and Prospects*'. The book — consisting of 16 chapters with contributions from 31 authors covers a wide range of topics on housing, such as the National Housing Policy, housing law, issues of land and housing, labour matters, public housing, technology and housing, and housing finance.

The book was slated for publication at the end of December 2013 and will be launched in January 2014.

Malaysia's First Human Development Report 2013 by United Nations Human Resource Development Project (UNHDR)

ISIS submitted a report on Inclusive Education for Malaysia's First Human Development Report 2013 by UNHDR. It was completed in April 2013.

Malaysian Foreign Policy Study Group Project

The project began with an inaugural meeting on 6 September 2012 with the participation of a high level study group. Several meetings were held ending with a final meeting on 10 June 2013 to finalize the report. The Report of the Malaysian Foreign Policy Study Group, titled 'Malaysia's Foreign Policy Toward and Beyond 2020: Vision, Goals and Recommendations', was submitted to the Prime Minister on 10 July 2013.

National Interest Analysis (NIA) on Malaysia's Involvement in the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) Negotiations

Commissioned in September 2013 by the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) Malaysia, a study team from ISIS met with academicians, nongovernmental organizations, lead negotiators, key political figures and captains of various sectors of industry and services to obtain their view-points.

The study team had presented its initial findings to the TPP NIA Steering Committee on three different occasions. A draft for the final report of the study was submitted to MITI on 16 December 2013. It was then revised based on comments from MITI, Ministry of Human Resources (MoHR), Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (NRE), Ministry of Finance (MoF) and Economic Planning Unit (EPU). The findings of the study will be presented to the Minister of MITI in January 2014.

Study on Competition Issues in the Food Distribution Sector of Malaysia

This study was commissioned by The World Bank as a component of their study on 'Assessing Market Conduct that Impedes Competition in Malaysia' for the Government of Malaysia with the Economic Planning Unit (EPU) of Malaysia as the executing agency. The study covered Peninsular Malaysia, Sabah and Sarawak and focused on the palm oil (cooking oil), poultry, and fruits and vegetables subsectors.

The Study Final Report was submitted in March 2013.

Unity in Education

In relation to the project of Developing Constructs for Unity Index in Schools, a draft report of the instrument to evaluate the unity index in schools was presented to the Management Committee of the Ministry of Education.

A joint study team from the Ministry of Education, Jabatan Perpaduan Negara dan Integrasi Nasional, Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris (UPSI) and ISIS Malaysia was formed, headed by the Minister of Education, to develop unity index for schools. The joint study team scheduled numerous school visits for data collection and analysis.

Unity in Education: Case Study by ISIS Malaysia

Seven secondary schools in Malaysia were visited by a team from ISIS Malaysia to collect data from students and teachers. A questionnaire each for the students and teachers were distributed to the samples. 280 students and 110 teachers responded to the questionnaire.

The information was collated from the data and a report of this case study is being written. The finished report will be sent to the Minister of Education and the Director-General of the Ministry of Education in early 2014.






