

1100 – 1230 Book Launch Panel: New Southern Policy as Catalyst for Deepening ASEAN-ROK Relations

The New Southern Policy (NSP), featuring the Republic of Korea's will to elevate economic and diplomatic ties across Three Pillars – People, Prosperity and Peace – was welcomed by Southeast Asian countries. Developing a book dedicated solely on the NSP, the project that began in July 2019 culminated in a publication that discussed various aspects of the NSP, inclusive of its potential to consolidate middle power for both the Republic of Korea and ASEAN, sharpen approaches in areas such as maritime security and the Mekong region, as well as present possibilities in preparation of future economic prosperity. Additionally, the book explores ways and means for ASEAN to be a strategic partner in reaching out to the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. Providing a snippet of the rich contents in the book are three writers with additional contributions by two discussants.

1400 – 1530 Future of the NSP: Building ASEAN-ROK Resilience During the Pandemic

The COVID-19 pandemic swept the world three years after the NSP was announced and a mere few months after the 30th anniversary of the ASEAN-ROK Dialogue Partnership. While the region grappled with a slowing economy, re-evaluation of existing systems and approaches to mitigate a public health crisis, the strategic conditions despite the pandemic uncovered new avenues of engagement to build resilience in the region. This special panel looks at possibilities for ASEAN-ROK relations after the pandemic and futures of the NSP. Panellists seek to discuss the aspirations for the NSP 2.0, possibilities for health diplomacy and ways of pursuing peace with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea amid a pandemic.

Tan Sri Hashim is the Chairman of the Board of ISIS Malaysia. He began his career in the military service at the age of 18. He was first commissioned in the Royal Malay Regiment in 1956 before being posted to the 3rd Battalion of the Royal Malay Regiment in 1957. He was later appointed the Chief of Staff in the Ministry of Defence in 1980, holding the rank of Major General. Tan Sri Hashim was appointed the Chief of Defence Forces in 1987 and retired in 1992 after 38 years of distinguished service. Currently, Tan Sri Hashim is also the Chairman of Ajinomoto (Malaysia) Berhad, Datasonic Group Berhad and National Aerospace & Defence Industries Sdn Bid, among others. General Hashim was conferred an Honorary Doctorate by the University of Salford – United Kingdom in 1999 and The National Defence University of Malaysia in 2012.

Ambassador Lee Chi Beom is former Minister of Environment of the Republic of Korea from 2006 to 2007. He has held various senior appointments in the field of environment including Secretary General of Korean Federation for Environment Movement (KFEM), Head of Korea Institute for Social and Environmental Policy, and President of Korea Environment and Resources Corporation. Prior to his posting as Ambassador of the Republic of Korea to Malaysia in 2019, Ambassador Lee was the Chairman of Northeast Asia Peace Economic Association of Korea. Ambassador Lee holds an MA in Philosophy and a BA in German Language and Literature, both from Seoul National University of Korea.

Dr Yeo's scholarly publications have appeared in International Studies Quarterly and Journal of East Asian Studies, among others. His interests cover a wide range of issues, including international relations theory, Asian security, the Korean politics and the US grand strategy.

Kuik serves on the editorial boards of Contemporary Southeast Asia, Australian Journal of International Affairs, and Asian Politics and Policy. He holds an MLitt from St Andrews, and a PhD from Johns Hopkins.


