- 3. This event is the result of a multi-stakeholder collaboration between ISIS Malaysia, the Japan Malaysia Association (JMA), the Embassy of Japan in Malaysia and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Japan.
- 4. I would like to congratulate the Embassy of Japan in Malaysia and its Malaysian counterpart for the event, the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) for successfully organising a series of year-long events to mark this momentous celebration.

- 5. When the Japan Malaysia Association approached us almost a year ago to host a series of discussions surrounding the Look East Policy, we, of course, did not hesitate to do so. The policy was instrumental for the historical economic development of Malaysia and Japan, of course, played a major role as a model for Malaysia's development. Eventually, ISIS Malaysia has collaborated with the embassy on three events. The first two were webinars a discussion on Japan's Society 5.0 on 28 March 2022, and an examination of the Look East Policy (LEP) on 18 May 2022. This culminated in the third collaboration, which is our event today. With the theme of past, present, and future, it comprises a book launch and a forum on Malaysia-Japan relations.
- 6. The book, titled *40* Years of The Look East Policy 1982-2022, was authored by Ms Akiko Kato and by the Japan Malaysia Association. It will be officially launched shortly by YAB Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad.
- 7. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Akiko Kato for all her hard work and determination throughout her research and writing process, especially when it comes to encapsulating the extensive elements of Look East Policy.
- 8. The second half of the event is a forum on Malaysia-Japan relations. It focuses on the changing regional landscape and aims to look both at developments and future directions of the bilateral relationship.

As a (much) younger man, when the Look East Policy was first announced by its architect, our keynote speaker today, YAB Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, I felt both excitement and trepidation in equal measures. It represented a seminal change for this country. Malaysia had for decades looked towards the West as a model of development. The shift in orientation, however, would not be easy. But four decades down the road, no one can deny the significant and fundamentally positive impacts that the Look East Policy, and indeed Japan, have played in Malaysia's national and international economic development.
- 10. Our shared strategic interests' values on democracy, rule of law, international trade and a stable and secure maritime domain have brought us closer. The task before us is to rediscover and rejuvenate past connections, strengthen current ties, and chart a path towards the future.

11. Undeniably, the substance that contributed to the cordial friendly bilateral relations between Malaysia and Japan are economic relations, cultural and people-to-people exchanges.
