Datuk Prof Dr Mohd Faiz Abdullah Chairman ISIS Malavsia

Prof Faiz leads the institute's policy development and Track 2 diplomacy, including through the ASEAN Institutes of Strategic and International Studies (ASEAN-ISIS) and Pacific Economic Cooperation Council (PECC). He is also the Malaysian representative to the ASEAN Regional Forum Experts and Eminent Persons (ARF EEP) meeting, co-chair of the Council for Security Cooperation in the Asia-Pacific (CSCAP) and a member of the World Economic Forum's Global Future Council on Good Governance.



HE Lada Phumas Ambassador of Thailand to Malaysia

HE Lada assumed her post in April 2023 with the goal of strengthening and advancing Thailand-Malaysia relations in the bilateral, regional and international sphere. She is the former consul-general in Shanghai. Her diplomatic career began in January 1994 at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. She has had stints in the Department of East Asian Affairs; Department of Economic Affairs (APEC); Department of ASEAN Affairs; and Department of Consular Affairs. She also served at the Royal Thai Embassy in Beijing; Permanent Mission of Thailand to the United Nations in Geneva; and ASEAN-China Centre.



Arividya Arimuthu Senior Fellow ISIS Malaysia

Arividya is a senior fellow in the chairman's office. She specialises in WTO and EU laws and has more than 20 years' experience in trade negotiations. She is a former senior director for strategic negotiations at MITI and chief negotiator for numerous high-stakes free trade agreement negotiations, including CPTPP, for which she led the ratification and implementation for Malaysia.



Bunn Sri na Nagara Head Renaissance Strategic Research Institute Malaysia

Bunn is a geostrategic consultant and the BRI Caucus for Asia-Pacific, Perak Academy honorary fellow and convenor of an expert study group on Sabah. He is a former senior fellow and visiting fellow at ISIS Malaysia. He is also a former associate of Universiti Malaya's Thai studies programme and member of the Malaysia-Thailand Think-Tank Network. His research covers East Asian integration, contemporary grand strategies and Global South transitions.

Dr Chaiwat is a faculty member at the Faculty of Liberal Arts, Thammasat University, and sits on the board of SEASREP Foundation. His expertise spans language, socio-cultural, economic and political issues, such as Muslims in Thailand, ethnic minorities, Malay studies, Malay language and culture, ethno-sociology, the Siamese issue in Malaysia, East Asian soft power in Southeast Asia and international relations in ASFAN

HE Damrong is a former career diplomat with more than 35 years of service. He is a former deputy permanent secretary at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and director-general of East Asia. His overseas stints include ambassador to Lao PDR; consul-general in Los Angeles; and deputy chief of mission in Washington. In his long diplomatic career, he served in Southeast Asia, particularly Myanmar, Malaysia and Laos. He served as deputy secretary-general of the Asian Peace and Reconciliation Council.

Kavi is a former executive editor of the Bangkok-based *The Nation* and editor-in-chief and executive director of the Yangon-based *Myanmar Times*. He is a former president of the Thai Journalists' Association and served as a member of jury and chair of the Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize.

Datuk Jojie has more than three decades' experience in bilateral and multilateral diplomacy. He is the former ambassador to Thailand, during which he also held the position of dean of the diplomatic corps. His postings include Ottawa, Baghdad, Ankara, Vienna and Havana, with concurrent accreditation to five Caribbean nations. As former director-general of the ASEAN-Malaysia National Secretariat, he played a pivotal role in advancing Malaysia's regional diplomacy. He has facilitated numerous prime ministerial visits, chaired key bilateral committees, and promoted economic, cultural and people-to-people ties.



Dr Pongphisoot BusbaratDirector

Dr Pongphisoot is assistant professor of international relations and assistant dean at the Faculty of Political Science, Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok. His research examines the role of norms and identity in shaping international relations by exploring its influence on Thailand's relations with major powers in East Asia, the US and China. His current projects focus on Thailand's strategic choices between the US and China, the domestic determinants of Thailand's foreign policy and geopolitical dynamics of great-power competition in the Indo-Pacific.



Thomas Daniel Director ISIS Malaysia

Thomas heads the Foreign Policy and Security Studies team, with a decade's experience in foreign policy and security analysis. His work focuses on how major-power dynamics impact on the strategic-security considerations of Southeast Asia. Within this scope, he mainly looks at the South China Sea dispute, political-security cohesion within ASEAN and Malaysia's security and foreign policies. He also focuses on policies towards refugees and asylum seekers in Malaysia and ASEAN's response to the Myanmar crisis.
