# 1000-1130 Session 1: The state of geopolitics today: perspectives from India and ASEAN

As India and ASEAN navigate a complex and dynamic geopolitical landscape, there is an unsaid urgency to recalibrate the terms of engagement between India and Southeast Asia. India's ability to adeptly compartmentalise its interests and strategic ties with diverse actors like the United States, China, Russia and the European Union makes it a valuable partner in the region. This also inevitably shapes Southeast Asia's perception of India's strategic intent. In the midst of geopolitical uncertainties, recalibrating India-ASEAN ties must be deliberate and forward-looking. It must identify how India can support ASEAN efforts in addressing regional challenges and greater regional integration. It must also map out ways in which India collaborates on inter-regionalism and minilateral mechanisms. How does the state of geopolitics today impact the India-ASEAN relationship?

# 1200-1330 Session 2: Converging pathways: AOIP and IPOI synergies and Indian-led initiatives

The ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific (AOIP) and India's Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) share a common vision of an open, inclusive, and cooperative regional order. While the AOIP underscores ASEAN centrality and emphasis on dialogue, connectivity, and sustainable development, the IPOI advances India's practical, pillar-based approach to maritime security, economic cooperation, and environmental stewardship. Both frameworks reject zero-sum dynamics, focusing instead on collective resilience and shared prosperity. The AOIP and IPOI should align, reinforcing ASEAN-India partnership in shaping a stable, rules-based and inclusive Indo-Pacific. How can India and ASEAN operationalize these synergies? Can Indian-led initiatives, joint initiatives and institutional collaboration lead the way?

# 1430-1600 Session 3: Regional AI governance: scope for ASEAN-India cooperation

India's emerging approach to AI safety combines innovation with robust governance. The Indian AI Governance Framework (2025–26) adopts a risk-based model grounded in accountability, transparency, and human-centric values. Backed by the India Stack—including Aadhaar, UPI, and DEPA—India has built scalable, secure, and inclusive digital infrastructure enabling trustworthy AI deployment. This model offers ASEAN valuable lessons on how public-led systems can ensure safety even amid resource constraints. While ASEAN's Guide on AI Governance and Ethics and Generative AI supplement mark regional progress, uneven readiness persists. India's experience with interoperable infrastructure, skills development, and ethical standards provides a foundation for deeper cooperation. How can India and ASEAN align AI safety approaches to regional realities?
